

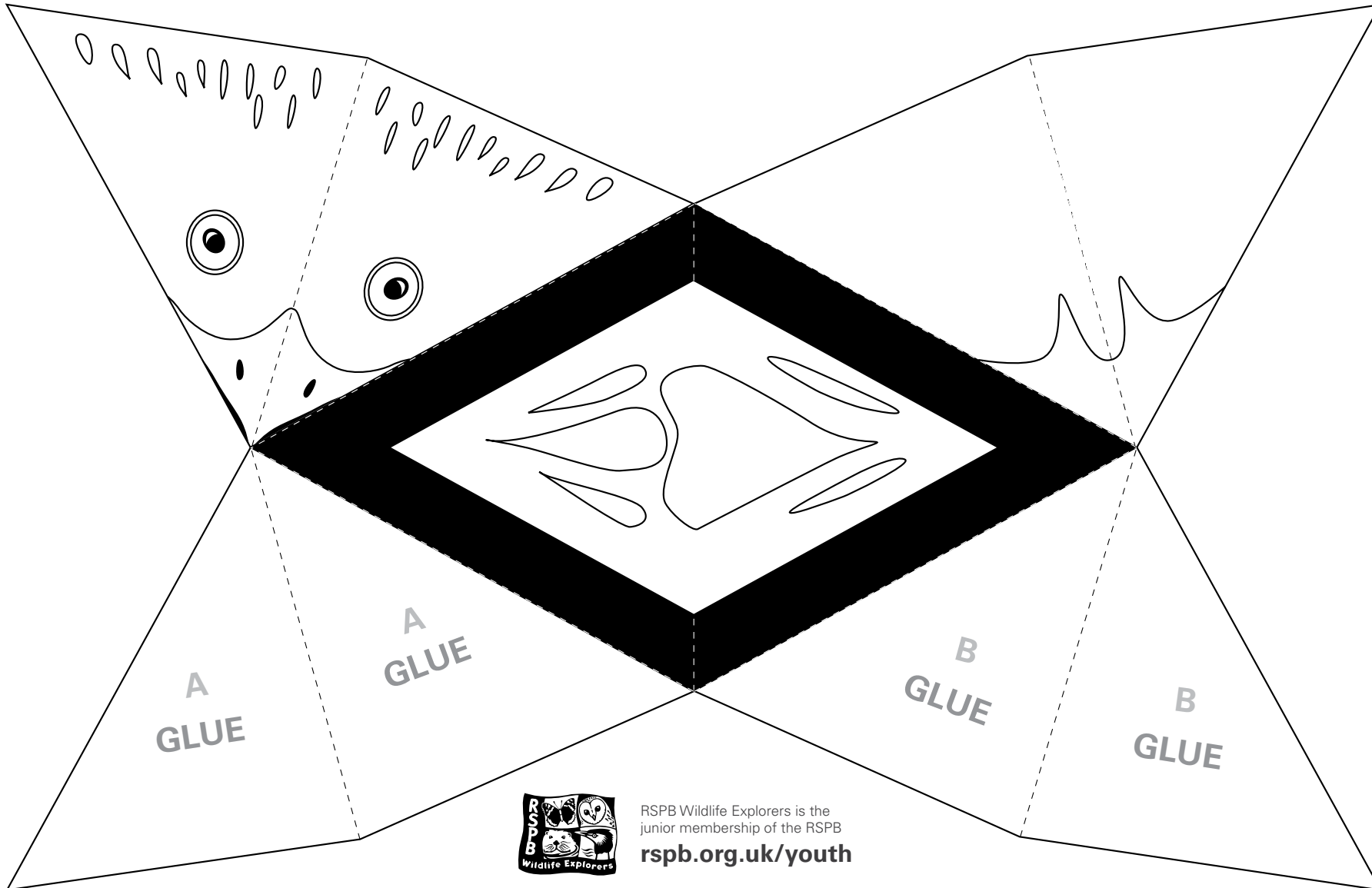
# Common gull snapper

## You will need:

- scissors
- glue
- brown, yellow, red and black colouring pencils
- double-sided tape.

## What to do:

- 1** Colour the streaks on the neck grey. Colour the inside of the mouth red. Colour the ring around the eyes red, the eyes very dark brown and the beak yellow. Leave the rest of the snapper white.
- 2** Cut all around the outside of the snapper.
- 3** Fold the snapper along the dotted lines with the coloured area facing outwards. Make sure you fold across the middle of the mouth too.
- 4** Put glue on the areas marked. Match A and B glued sections under the head and beak, and squeeze them together until they stick.
- 5** Inside the top and bottom halves of the beak where circles are marked, stick a little piece of double-sided tape. Put your fingers on the tape and start snapping!
